

EXTREMELY RARE DAGUERREOTYPE OF FINANCIER JOHN MURRAY FORBES

* 474

JOHN MURRAY FORBES (1813-1898). Railroad executive; Businessman; Public servant. Having accumulated a substantial fortune by 1846, Forbes turned his considerable talents to railroad construction and financings. He was the prime mover in purchasing and completing the unfinished Michigan Central RR, and constructing the roads which formed the nucleus of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy RR, of which he became president in the late 1870s. Always publicspirited citizen, Forbes made certain that the railroads in which he had an interest displayed a character and stability which significantly distinguished them from most of the other railroads of the day. His civic involvement began at the start of the Civil War, when he helped put the state of Massachusetts prepare for war, and he was instrumental in organizing the state's black regiments. In 1863, he was sent to England to block construction of, or to purchase, the so-called Laird rams that we being built there for the Confederacy. Throughout the war, his advice was constantly sought by all branches of government. A longtime member of the national executive committee of the Republican party, he broke with the party upon its nomination of James Blaine for the presidency in 1884.

An extremely rare 1/2 plate daguerreotype of a seated John Murray Forbes reading a newspaper. This image is very similar to one shown in the "Time Life" book "The Railroaders" and was in all probability done at the same time as this one. A very rare image. \$3,000 - up



AN AMBROTYPE PORTRAIT OF JOEL BARLOW

* 475

A fine, clean ambrotype of JOEL BARLOW (1754 - 1812)Public official, poet, and author of the mock-heroic poem The Hasty Pudding, Prom. In 1788 Barlow went to France as the agent of the Scioto Land Company and induced the company of Frenchmen who ultimately founded Gallipolis, Ohio, to emigrate to America. In Paris he became a liberal in religion and an advanced republican in politics. In England he published various radical essays, including Advice to the Privileged Orders (1792), proscribed by the British government. In 1792 he was made a French citizen. Thomas Paine had become his friend in England, and during Paine's imprisonment in Paris Barlow effected the publication of The Age of Reason.In 1795-97 he was sent to Algiers to secure a release of U.S. prisoners and to negotiate treaties with Tripoli, Algiers, and Tunis. He returned to the United States in 1805 and lived near Washington, D.C., until 1811, when he became U.S. plenipotentiary to France. He became involved in Napoleon's retreat from Russia and died in Poland of exposure.

A fine ¼ plate ambrotype identified within the case. Early notes indicate the family held the image for some time, "Joel Barlow Uncle of My Grandmother Rebecca Barlow. Brother of my great grandfather Col. Aar4on Barlow. C. Wing" the top half of the case is missing. A fine ambrotype attributed to a prominent American. \$500 – up





A RARE REPORT PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE ANNOUNCING THE RESULTS OF THE ELECTORAL VOTE TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONFIRMING FDR'S ELECTION TO HIS FIRST TERM OF OFFICE AS PRESIDENT

"The undersigned, Otis F. Glenn and William H. King, tellers on the part of the Senate, Lamar Jeffers and Charles L. Gifford, tellers on the part of the House of Representatives, report the following as the result of the ascertainment and counting of the electoral vote for President and Vice President of the United States for the term beginning on the fourth day of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-

A printed large document printed and signed by the tellers of the House and Senate officially announcing FDR's landslide victory over Herbert Hoover. This document was printed by the Government Printing Office just after the election in 1932 and apparently distributed internally to members of the House and Senate to officially notify them of the results. The results of each state details votes cast for both Presidents and Vice-Presidents and detail one of the largest defeats in Presidential election history.

"The state of the vote for President of the United States, as deliverd to the President of the Senate is as follows:

The whole number of the electors appointed to vote for President of the United States is 531, of which a majority is 266.

Franklin D. Roosevelt of the State of New York, has received for President of the Untied States 472 votes; Herbert Hoover, of the State of California, has received

The state of the vote for Vice President of the United States, as delivered to the President of the Senate, is as follows:

The whole number of the electors appointed to vote for Vice President of the Untied States is 531, of which a majority is 266.

John N. Garner, of the State of Texas, has received for Vice President of the United States 472 votes: Charles Curtis of the the State of Kansas, has received 59 votes.

This announcement of the state of the vote by the President of the Senate shall be deemed a sufficient declaration of the persons elected President and Vice President of the United States, each for the term beginning on the fourth day of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-three, and shall be entered, together with a list of the votes, on the Journals of the Senate and House of Representatives.'

The item remains in its original frame from the 1930's and measures 13" x 29" overall. This is an extraordinarily historically interesting piece of political history from the election which would lead to FDR becoming the only four term President in U.S. history. Overall Fine. \$1,500 - up









The term "Roulette" is derived from a French word meaning small wheel. The origin of Roulette is not very clear. while some sources state that Blaise Pascal, a 17th Century French mathematician invented the roulette wheel, other sources state that the game originated in China and was brought to Europe by Dominican monks who were trading with the Chinese. During the late 18th century the Roulette wheel became very popular when Prince Charles (ruler of Monaco at the time) introduced gambling to Monaco as a way of alleviating the financial problems of the region. However, the modern version of the Roulette wheel did not appear until 1842 when Frenchmen Francois and Louis Blanc invented the single "0" roulette game. The game was eventually brought to America in the early 1800s. However, the single "0" modification was rejected in America and the two zeros "00" where returned to the Roulette wheel. The Roulette wheel gained a great deal of popularity in America during the California Gold Rush.





Of the first part, and Mary Caldwell of Hartford in the County of Harford and State of Connecticut of the second part..." in which Caldwell assigns "her actual possession now being, and to her heirs and assigns forever, One Thousand acres of Land in the Township of Brownington in the Connecticut Susquehanna Company purchase, it being the one half of the original right of Daniel Edwards and deeded by Christian Caldwell and May his wife, to the said Brown on the Twenty-eighty day of June one thousand seven hundred and ninety four..."

Susquehanna Company, land company formed (1753) in Connecticut for the purpose of developing the Wyoming Valley in Pennsylvania. A tract of land was purchased from the Native Americans in 1754, and preparations were made for development. Aid was sought in England and Eliphalet Dyer was sent in an unsuccessful attempt to secure confirmation of the land grant. Colonization from Connecticut was first attempted in 1762–63, but it was 1769 before any definite settlement was made. Soon the settlers were embroiled in troubles with the rival settlers from Pennsylvania, leading to the Pennamite Wars, in which Zebulon Butler led the Connecticut forces. In World War II, he commanded the PT-109, which was sunk by a Japanese destroyer. He was first elected to Congress in 1946 and elected to the Senate in 1952, where he wrote Profiles In Courage. He narrowly defeated Richard Nixon for the Presidency in 1960.

This is the first and only stock certificate we've had or seen of JFK owning or signing any stock or bond. In fact, his high profile in government office would have made it highly unlikely that he held shares in corporations from his becoming a political figure until his death. The certificate is currently in a frame with photocopies displaying the verso with JFK's signature and transfer information. Additionally a letter from is provided detailing the ownership of the certificate from a descendent of the newspaper's owner who was a close friend of Kennedy's until his death, having met the latter during the war. Kennedy bought 20 shares of common stock of the newspaper for a total of \$2,000 in 1946 and agreed to serve as the corporation's vice-president, a position he relinquished after assuming his position in the House of Representatives.

A complete letter detailing the circumstances of Kennedy's ownership and investment in the Narragansett Times from the newspaper owner's descendent accompanies the certificate, a copy of which can be provided to interested bidders. During that year, 3 pounds of dynamite were developed and successfully tested in a trial blast of bolders. This is widely considered to be the first manufacture and use of dynamite in the United States following Alfred Nobel's invention in 1866. Following the success of the initial trials, Judson formed the Giant Powder Company and the Judson Powder Company, patenting "Giant Powder, No. 2" in 1873 which became synonomous for dynamite in the United States

HENRY LEE DODGE (1825 – 1901). Prominent San Francisco politician and businessman, Dodge co-founded the Fireman's Fund, served as superintendent of the United States Mint in San Francisco and was a long time president of the Society of California Pioneers.



His uncanny ability to work for days on end with little rest has been well-documented, and his rare combination of inventive genius and business acumen allowed not only inventive, but also commercial success. While his inventions are too numerous to list, of course, among his best known are the light bulb, phonograph, storage battery and film projector. He held more than 1,000 patents at the time of his death. This is truly one of the most popular of Edison signed stocks. Stamp and punch cancellations not affecting either of Edison's signatures. 

When the U.S. Government refused to redeem these bonds, overseas holders of Confederate bonds formed a Confederate Bondholders association in England to lobby the U.S. Government for redemption of the bonds. Many British and European holders of Confederate bonds, then, consigned their bonds to the care of this association in hopes that the association would be successful in arranging for bond redemption. On verso are the "Conditions for Deposit," among which are enumerated the responsibilities of the Trustees: ". . to agree to any arrangement for settlement of the Bondholders' claims either wholly or partially, to give receipts and discharges, and in all respects to act as the representatives of the Bondholders as the Trustees in their absolute discretion may



The certificate which was attached to the transfer with wax has separated at upper left and thus the upper left corner is torn away but remains on the transfer document.
